# PAYING FOR COLLEGE

## Tools for Maine Families

**The cost of college should not discourage you from going!** Although families have the primary responsibility to pay for college, federal financial aid and other resources are available to help students and families pay for college expenses.

**The Finance Authority of Maine (FAME)** is available to assist you as you go through the process of applying for and receiving financial aid. Visit the FAME Web site at [www.famemaine.com/education](http://www.famemaine.com/education) for more information on any of the topics below.

### FINANCIAL AID

#### 1 Step One – Prepare ✓

- Know the financial aid deadlines at the colleges you are interested in attending. Financial aid funds are limited, so be sure to **file your FAFSA on time!**
- Go to [www.fafsa4caster.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa4caster.ed.gov) and get an early start on the financial aid process.

#### 2 Step Two - Apply ✓

- Complete the FAFSA online at [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov).
- Submit the FAFSA as soon after January 1 as possible, or as soon as you decide to go to college.
- Don't wait until your taxes are completed; use estimated tax information and make changes later.
- Print and save your confirmation page.
- The FAFSA is free. Don't pay anyone to submit your FAFSA.

#### 3 Step Three - Follow-Up ✓

- Carefully review your FAFSA Student Aid Report (SAR) for accuracy. If you used estimated tax information, verify the figures and make corrections at [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov).
- Your Expected Family Contribution (EFC) is calculated based on the information you provide on the FAFSA and will be listed on your SAR. The EFC is not necessarily the amount that you can expect to pay for college.
- The colleges you list on your FAFSA will receive your FAFSA information electronically.
- Many colleges require additional forms such as tax returns and W-2's. **Be sure to respond quickly to all requests for information.**

#### 4 Step Four – Receive & Respond ✓

- You will receive a financial aid award from the colleges where you have been accepted. Many colleges begin sending (or e-mailing) financial aid awards in mid-March. Contact the financial aid office if you have questions about the status of your award.
- Carefully review your award, including the types of aid that you are offered. Typically, you will need to respond to the college or provide additional information.
- Contact the financial aid office at your college if there are changes to your family's financial circumstances, such as unemployment or reduced work hours.

### FAME PROGRAMS

**State of Maine Grant Program** - A need-based state grant awarded to undergraduate students attending an eligible college in Maine, Connecticut, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Vermont or District of Columbia.

**Educators for Maine Program** - A renewable, merit-based forgivable loan program for Maine residents pursuing careers in education.

**Medical Education Programs** - Programs to assist students pursuing a postgraduate medical, dental or veterinary education.

**Tuition Waiver Programs** - Available for students who attend the University of Maine System, the Maine Community College System or Maine Maritime Academy and meet one of the following conditions: 1) student is a child or spouse of a firefighter, law enforcement officer or emergency medical services personnel killed in the line of duty; 2) student was a foster child under the custody of the Maine Department of Health and Human Services when he/she graduated from high school; 3) student is an adopted person or minor ward of a permanency guardian whose adoptive parent or guardian receives a subsidy from the Maine Department of Health and Human Services.

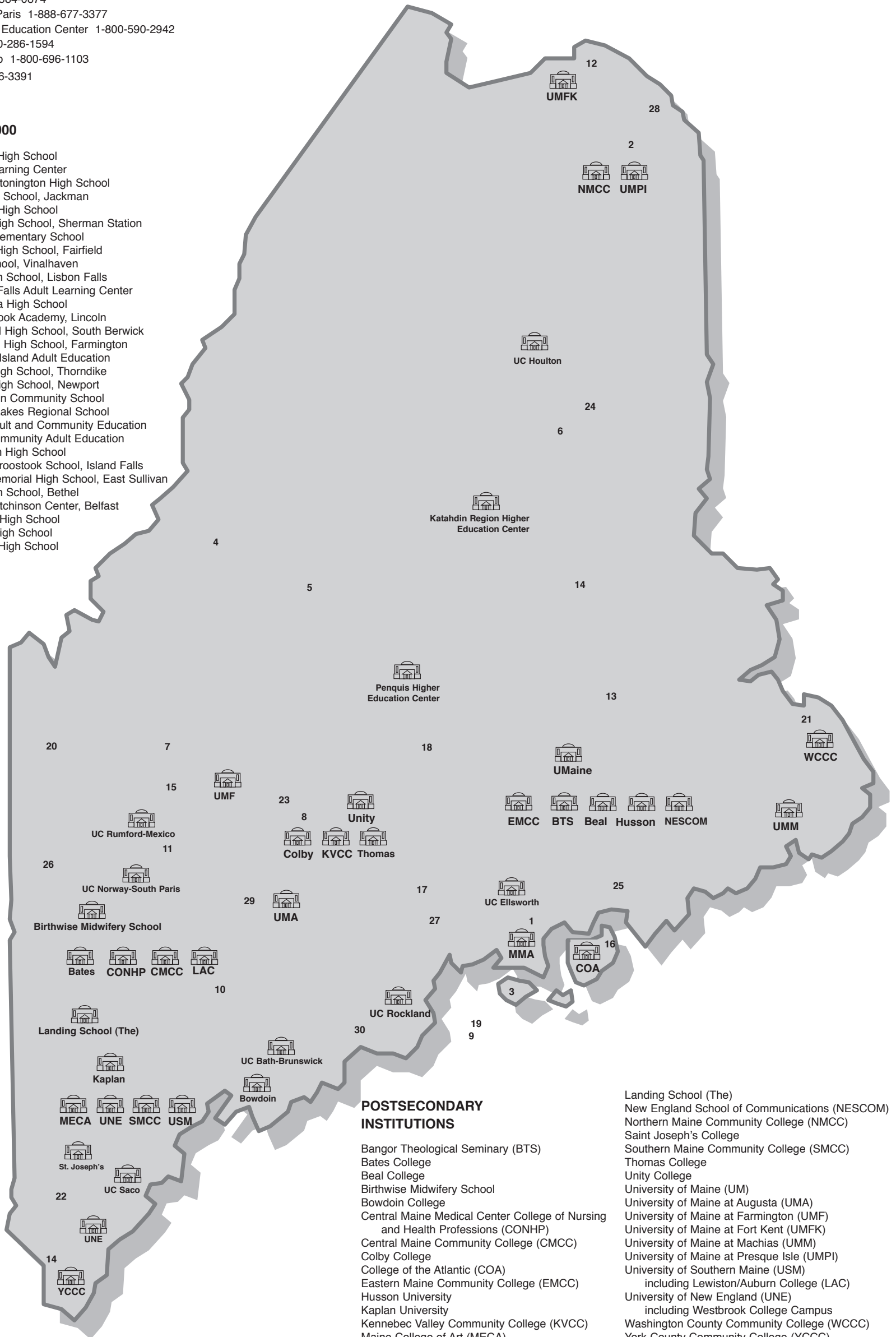

# SENIOR YEAR CALENDAR

## September

- Develop a checklist for each college you are interested in attending. Include financial aid deadlines and application information.
- Attend college fairs or open houses.

## October

- Begin college essays.
- Ask teachers, coaches or guidance counselors to write letters of recommendations for college applications.
- Begin researching scholarship opportunities using free scholarship searches on the Internet, or meet with your guidance counselor.

## November

- Attend a financial aid information session.
- Continue researching scholarship opportunities.
- Submit CSS Profile form to colleges that require it.

## December

- Become familiar with the FAFSA application. Go to [www.fafsa4caster.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa4caster.ed.gov).
- Begin completing scholarship applications. Be aware of specific deadlines.

## January

- Complete and submit your FAFSA form at [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov).
- Keep copies of all documents and forms.
- Attend College Goal Sunday.
- Continue completing scholarship applications.

## February

- Verify the information on your Student Aid Report and make corrections if necessary.
- Check with financial aid offices to confirm they received your FAFSA information.
- Submit any required documents to the financial aid offices by the college's deadline.

## March

- Look for your financial aid award letters to arrive in the mail or by e-mail. Respond quickly to all requests for additional information.

## April

- Confirm that the financial aid offices have received all necessary paperwork.
- Notify all colleges of your plans to attend (or not). Many colleges require an admission deposit and typically have a deadline of May 1.

## May

- To be eligible for the State of Maine Grant, you must submit your FAFSA by May 1.
- Line up your summer job to begin earning money for out-of-pocket college expenses such as books and personal expenses.

## June - Congratulations on your High School Graduation!

- If you have been awarded private scholarships, send copies of all your private scholarship notifications to the college financial aid office.

## Summer

- Look for your fall semester tuition bill.
- Make arrangements to pay your balance.
