WTS fosters the development of women and girls in the transportation field by encouraging bright new professionals and students to undertake technical careers in the area of transportation. One way this is accomplished is by awarding the WTS – Maine High School Scholarship to young women pursuing undergraduate studies in science, technology, engineering, or math.

WTS – Maine Chapter works to make a difference in our communities by offering this scholarship to encourage highly motivated young women to explore exciting careers that will change the face of the transportation industry.

This year WTS – Maine Chapter is offering two High School Scholarships. The first is for \$2,500 and the second is for \$1,000. The minimum criteria for selection are:

- a. Applicant must be a female high school senior in the State of Maine or must have graduated from a high school in the State of Maine within the last year.
- b. Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- c. Currently studying math, science, and technology.
- d. Considering a career in a transportation-related field.

Applications must be submitted through the local WTS – Maine Chapter as typed word documents. Scholarships are competitive and selection is based on the applicant's specific transportation goals, academic record, leadership roles and extracurricular activities.
