

Thank you for all you do to encourage your students to file a FAFSA!

FAFSA completion is a big deal and FAME is here to support you and your students. And, **new this year**, we're offering a fun incentive- **two \$500 prizes**- to encourage students to file. We are looking for the schools that can achieve the highest **percentage increase in FAFSA filing** from the Class of 2019 to the Class of 2020.

Here's how it will work:

Check out your school's FAFSA filing percentage for the Class of 2019. This percentage is as of May 1, 2019 and is based on your October 1 census data reported to the Maine Department of Education. We will share the Class of 2020 percentage on a bi-weekly basis starting in January of 2020. Final rates will be calculated as of May 15, 2020.

There will be two \$500 prizes- one from among small schools- those with a senior class enrollment under 100 students - and one from among the big schools- those with a senior class enrollment over 100 students. This prize can be used toward Project Graduation, Senior Prom, or a senior class trip.

TO ENCOURAGE FAFSA COMPLETION, WE RECOMMEND THE FOLLOWING:

- Hand out or mail FAFSA postcards to students
- Post reminders about FAFSA completion on social media
- Make FAFSA-related PA announcements, including at sporting events
- Email or text FAFSA reminders to students and parents
- Promote FAME's FAFSA events by emailing, texting or calling families
- Offer students extra credit or a privilege if they demonstrate that they've filed their FAFSA
- Give students a gift card (like to Dunkin', Starbucks, or for gas) if they demonstrate that they've filed their FAFSA
- Sign up for and use FAME FAFSA Completion Portal to see who has or has not filed a FAFSA
- Hang you FAFSA Completion Thermometer poster in a prominent location and update your FAFSA completion percentage regularly

Why is FAFSA completion so important?

Recent research has shown that <u>post-secondary enrollment after high school is higher for students in all income levels</u> when they file a FAFSA. Even more striking is that lower income students are about 127 percent more likely to be enrolled in the fall following high school graduation if they file a FAFSA than their counterparts who don't file a FAFSA.
