



GUIDE TO COLLEGE FAIRS

AT COLLEGE FAIRS **YOU CAN:**

- 1** Visit a variety of different schools under one roof and build your list of options.
- 2** Talk with admissions staff to “interview” schools to get a feel for whether a school is a good fit.
- 3** Show your interest in schools by filling out inquiry cards and joining their mailing lists. Some schools tally how many “contacts” students have made to gauge their interest.
- 4** Network and collect business cards from admissions staff for future questions. They are often the people making admissions decisions.
- 5** Learn more about financial aid and scholarships by talking to school staff and representatives from various scholarship programs.

FOR A COLLEGE FAIR OR CAMPUS VISIT

ABOUT THE SCHOOL

- What makes your school unique?
- What is your most popular major?
- Are classes offered both in-person and online?
- Are most classes taught by professors or teaching assistants?
- What is the average class size?
- What percentage of students have a job within one year of graduation?

APPLYING FOR ADMISSION

- When is the admissions deadline?
- Tell me about the admissions process.
- What is the most important admissions criterion at your school: test scores, grades, extracurricular activities, or volunteer experience?
- Do you require SAT scores?
- What advice would you give someone applying to your school?

CAMPUS LIFE

- What are the dining options on campus?
- What are the on-campus housing options?
- How safe is the campus? Is it safe to walk alone at night?

STUDENT SUCCESS

- What percentage of students return for their sophomore year?
- What is the graduation rate?
- Is tutoring available on campus? Is it free and easy to access?
- Does your school have a Career Center to help students find jobs after graduation?

FINANCIAL AID AND MONEY

- How do I apply for financial aid?
- What forms are required (in addition to the FAFSA)?
- What is the financial aid deadline?
- Do you offer both need- and merit-based aid?
