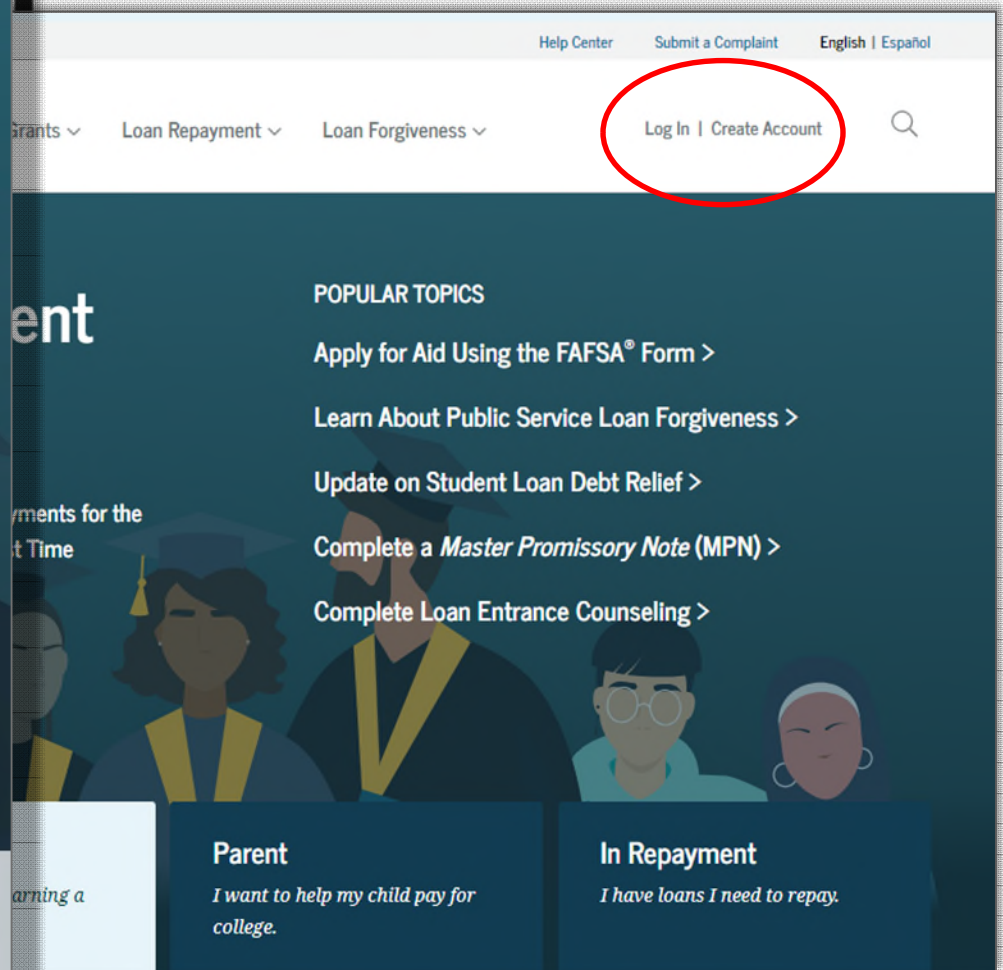
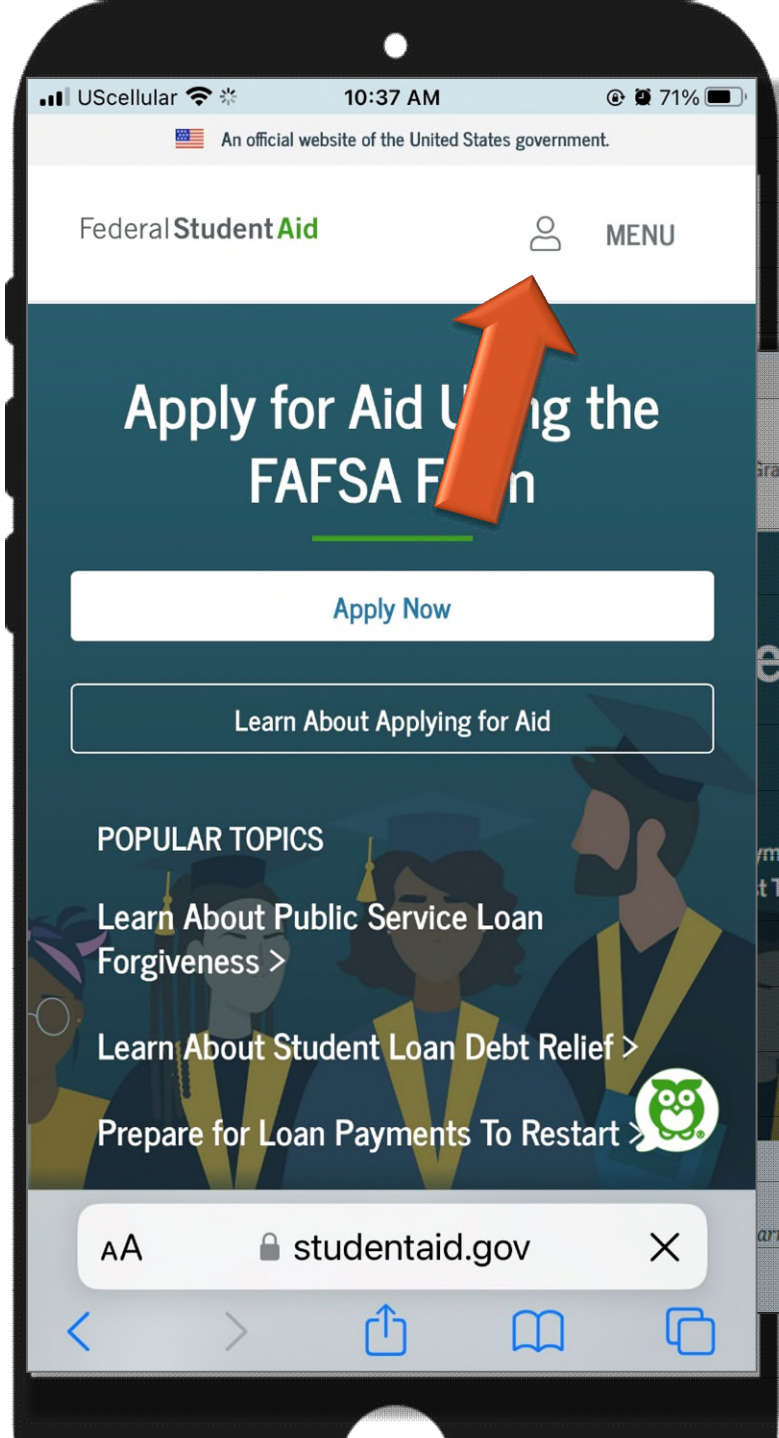


Steps to Get Ready to File a FAFSA

Contributors Must Create Federal Student Aid

Contributors without an FSA ID should create an account **at least several days prior to** filing the FAFSA).

- If FSA ID has not been authenticated **manual entry of all tax related questions** will be required.
- Accounts are created at StudentAid.gov
 - Individuals will need a **unique email address** that can be accessed as it must be verified.
 - Students **should not** use their high school email address. Instead, **create a new email address!**



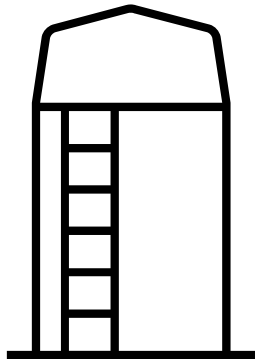


Filing the FAFSA Dependent Students

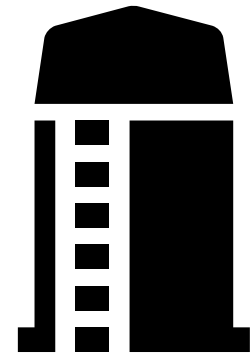
Student Section



Either student or parent can start the FAFSA and they will “**invite**” the other to complete the FAFSA.

The invite is what connects the student and parent sections of the FAFSA.

Parent Section



Based on our limited experience, it appears to best **if** everyone is available and parents are **willing** to provide SSN, to have the student start the FAFSA.

If the student is not available or if parents are unwilling to share their SSN, parents can start the FAFSA.
