

Maine SNAP Employment and Training Program

- SNAP E&T is a USDA funded employment and training program for SNAP recipients- and available in all states.
- In Maine SNAP E&T is administered by Maine DHHS Office for Family Independence.
- Maine SNAP E&T helps participants get job training and education so they can find and keep good paying jobs.
- Maine SNAP E&T is available at no cost to participants and helps with training, tuition, transportation, and other supports.
- You may be eligible for SNAP E&T if you:
 - Receive federal SNAP Benefits,
 - Are age 16 or older,
 - Are not receiving TANF cash assistance, and
 - Are willing and able to work upon completion.





What is the HOPE Program?

Higher Opportunity for Pathways to Employment

- An education assistance program administered by the Maine Department of Health and Human Services, Office for Family Independence
- Provides financial support to qualified parenting students for costs related to training and education programs beyond high school
- Supplies student navigators to help students stay in school and complete programs of study



Goals of HOPE



Improve parents' access to quality education



Promote educational success by providing financial resources and navigator support



Increase economic prosperity through the attainment of credentials of value



Open and expand career pathways that build family wellbeing and fill Maine's workforce needs

Guiding Principles of HOPE

Education is a Marathon


By providing parenting students with access to support services, we can assist them in getting to the finish line.



Guiding Principles of HOPE

- Address education-related financial challenges faced by parenting students
- Offer higher education navigators to help parents address matters that get in the way of completing higher education

Who Does HOPE Serve?

Non-Financial Guidelines

HOPE is a statewide program that can serve up to 800 students at one time.

Participants must be:


- Maine resident ages 16-64
- U.S. citizen or qualifying noncitizen
- Higher education student –
 either accepted to or enrolled
 in an eligible program
- Lacking a marketable bachelor's degree



Who Does HOPE Serve?

Financial Guidelines

To be eligible for HOPE, all the following apply:



- Income at or below 225% of the Federal Poverty Level
- Applicant assets at or below \$10,000
- Income of minor children, child support, and alimony is excluded from income calculation

Questions to Ask


If a Student:



Is caring for a child under 18



Has income that falls at or below 225% of the Federal Poverty Level



Is not receiving monthly TANF benefit



Is attending or accepted into a training or education program beyond high school



Does not have a bachelor's degree



HOPE may be an option!

Navigators are:


- Campus-based
