



Scholarships

2025 Community College Scholarship

Quick Facts:

- \$1500 per semester, renewable up to four semesters
- Additional funding available if student goes on to a 4-year partner college, or is enrolled in a 3-year
- community college program (up to \$14,500 total)
- Student support provided throughout college career

Eligibility:

- Maine Resident graduating in 2024 from a WSF partner high school
- High School GPA in the "C range" or higher as determined by the high school
- SAI of \$30,000 or less
- Must be accepted to college prior to applying
- Full-time enrollment at a Maine Community College



2025 Four-year College Scholarship

- **Mitchell Scholarship**



A \$10,000 College Scholarship Plus So Much More

- Awards 200 scholarship recipients yearly, at least one recipient at each public high school in Maine
- In addition to the \$10,000 college scholarship (paid in four annual and equal installments of \$2,500), Mitchell Scholars receive access to a broad range of free programs, resources, and additional funding opportunities — throughout their college years and beyond.
- To be eligible for a Mitchell Scholarship, applicants must be:
 - full-time residents of Maine and be on track to graduate from a public high school in Maine.
 - Applicants should plan to attend a two-year or four-year degree program at an accredited college or university in the fall semester immediately following their high school graduation.
 - Students pursuing a two-year degree are eligible for up to four years of scholarship support if they continue their education beyond the initial two years.

Competitive Skills Scholarship Program (Maine Career Centers)

CSSP provides funding and support services for eligible Maine residents to pursue two and four-year degree programs or employer recognized credentials leading to high-wage, in-demand jobs in Maine.

Eligibility Requirements

- •Be at least 18 years old or have graduated from High School
- Live in Maine
- •Seeking a degree/credential for a job in a high wage/in demand occupation
- •Do not have a marketable post-secondary degree
- •Have household income of less than 200% of the federal poverty level
- •Can complete the education or training program



The Competitive Skills Scholarship pays for tuition and fees that are not covered by other sources, including federal financial aid. CSSP funding may also assist with other supports while you are in training including childcare, transportation, books, supplies, equipment, and remedial and prerequisite training

Eligible applicants can receive up to \$10,000 per year for a full-time student or \$5,000 per year for a part-time student each year you remain in your training program.

The Tuition Waiver Program (Foster Care)

Certain foster children and adopted children/wards under subsidy from the Maine Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) may receive a tuition waiver to a participating Maine public college/university.

▼ Who Is Eligible?

Eligible students must meet one of the following conditions at the time of graduation from high school or upon completion of HiSET/GED or equivalent:

- Be in Maine's foster care program
- Be adopted from Maine's foster care program and adoptive parent(s) receive a subsidy from Maine DHHS*
- Be a minor ward of a permanency guardian and guardian(s) receive a subsidy from Maine DHHS

Note: FAME will verify your status with DHHS upon receipt of your application.

* If the Maine DHHS subsidy is waived by the adoptive parent(s), the student is no longer eligible for a tuition waiver.

▼ How Do I Apply?

The 2025-2026 application cycle is now open.

There is no deadline for the Tuition Waiver (Foster Care) Program application. Please note that resources are limited and allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.

About Educators for Maine

The Educators for Maine Program is a competitive, merit-based, **forgivable loan** for Maine students enrolling in or pursuing undergraduate or graduate education degrees. Applicants must demonstrate an interest in careers in education or child care and are planning to work in Maine after graduation.

Who Is Eligible?

- Students must be Maine residents.
- Students must be graduating high school seniors, undergraduate, or graduate students accepted into postsecondary degree programs.
- Students must have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Undergraduate students must be enrolled full time in an accredited U.S. college or university. Graduate students must be enrolled at least half time in an accredited U.S. college or university.
- Students must be pursuing initial certification as a teacher, including speech pathologist, or the attainment child care provider qualifications. An individual who has already obtained certification is not eligible for this program.

May 1, 2025. Applications submitted without all required documents will be considered incomplete.



Eligibility:

- Anyone Age 16+
- Work authorization
- Able to work full time

Other requirements determined by employer may include:

- High school diploma
- Driver's License
- 18+
- Background checks
- Drug testing
- Aptitude testing
- Physical/fitness testing



Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) provides a monthly benefit to help low-income households purchase nutritious food.

If you receive SNAP you may also be eligible to participate in Maine SNAP-Ed or <u>Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Employment and Training (SNAP E&T)</u>

What do I need to do to apply?

Eligibility for SNAP is based on income, assets, expenses and household size. You will need to fill out an application, complete an interview and provide verification of your household's income, identity, citizenship status, assets and other items depending on your household circumstances.

You might be eligible for the HOPE Program if you:

- 1. Are a parent or caretaker relative of a minor child who is living with you.
- 2. Are a Maine resident between the ages of 16 through 64.
- 3. Meet the <u>financial qualifications</u>. See below to see what this means for you.
- 4. Have been accepted to or are enrolled at least half-time in a <u>qualifying training</u> <u>or education program</u> beyond high school. If you are enrolled less than half-time, the HOPE Program needs to approve this.
- 5. Are not currently receiving, or someone in your family unit is not currently receiving, a monthly TANF or PaS cash benefit.
- 6. Are a U.S. citizen or eligible non-U.S. citizen. Many non-citizens are eligible.
- 7. Do not already have a marketable bachelor's degree.
- 8. Are making satisfactory progress in your training or education program (based on your school's standards) and you are on track to graduate.

If you fit the description above, you may be eligible and want to <u>apply</u>. If you are unsure if you are eligible, you should <u>contact us</u> to find out more. We are happy to help.

Students have 120 days to complete both programs from the date of course access (including taking and passing the final exam).



Qualify for Free Tuition?

The Promise Program guarantees that first-time, full-tir receive an annual tuition discount package that covers (30 credits plus standard fees)

FREE for Four Award

Selected recipients will receive a combination of both grant and scholarship funds to cover the annual cost of standard tuition and fees. Recipients are required to attend as full time students and successfully complete 12 credit hours per semester.

A limited number of awards are available for first time, full-time or transfer students from Maine who have filed a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), are Pell Grant eligible, and have a Student Aid Index (SAI) of 6,655 or lower. Priority will be given to students who apply for Financial Aid by March 31st. If applying after March 31st, please contact the UMPI Admissions Office for details and availability.

For Maine Families Award

Maine applicants who are not Pell-eligible or have a Student Aid Index (SAI) of 6,656 or higher may receive significant reductions for tuition and fees (at least \$4,600 or more in financial aid grants and scholarships).

Free tuition for qualifying Maine students our Downeast Promise.

The University of Maine at Machias is pleased to offer the Downeast Promise program in support of Maine students and families. The Doaccess to higher education, and increases affordability so more Maine students can earn a college degree.

The Downeast Promise guarantees that **all first-time**, **full-time**, **Pell Grant-eligible Maine residents** receive sufficient grant and/or schedits per year of tuition and standard fees — a savings of around \$9,000 annually.



The INSPIRE Maine Pathways Scholarship Program guarantees grant and/or scholarship funding, to qualifying Maine residents, covers 100% of tuition and mandatory fees at UMaine for up to 8 semesters over 4 years, or 120 credits, whichever comes first. https://umaine.edu/stuaid/inspireme/

PATHWAY 1

Eligibility Criteria:

- Maine resident
- First-time, first-year and new transfer, undergraduate students, applying and accepted to the University of Maine for Summer or Fall, pursuing a first bachelor's degree
- Eligible for Federal Pell Grant and an SAI (Student Aid Index) from the FAFSA of less than **6,655** (maximum SAI is subject to change each year based on federally set Pell Grant amounts).

Potential Award Amount:

 100% of tuition and mandatory fees covered by grants and/or scholarships

PATHWAY 2

Eligibility Criteria:

- Maine resident
- First-time, first-year and new transfer, undergraduate students, applying and accepted to the University of Maine for Summer or Fall, pursuing a first bachelor's degree
- Qualifying family Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) and assets, as
 calculated on the FAFSA, of less than \$75,000

Potential Award Amounts:

 100% of tuition and mandatory fees covered by grants and/or scholarships



What is the UNE Tuition-Free Program?

- UNE's Tuition-Free Program (TFP) provides eligible students accepted for fall 2025 into an undergraduate program of study with the opportunity to attend the <u>University tuition</u> <u>free for up to 4 years.</u>
- The TFP covers tuition for full-time enrollment in an undergraduate program for eligible students. Additional educational related costs include, but are not limited to, required fees, residence hall, and dining charges.

Eligible students must meet the following criteria:

- Accepted into an undergraduate program of study for fall
 2025 of the 2025-2026 academic year.
- Have a cumulative, unweighted high school GPA of 3.85+
- First-time, first-year students only, attending college immediately or shortly after graduating from high school.
- Attend on a full-time basis. (12+ credits/semester).
- Live on campus.
- Must file a FAFSA for the 2025-2026 academic year, demonstrate an Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) of less than \$100,000 for the 2023 tax year, and have a Student Aid Index (SAI) of 0.
- Must accept all Federal and State Grant Aid included in the financial aid package.
- Must be classified as a dependent for financial aid purposes. Independent students should reach out to Student Financial Services for details about eligibility.



Please note: If you aren't eligible or can't complete the FAFSA, contact the colleges' Financial Aid Office. All federal and state aid is applied before the Free College Scholarship.



5 Complete Your Certificate or Degree

You can access the scholarship for up to 200% of the program completion time. (i.e. If your program takes two years, you have up to four years to complete it.)

New this year: Part time is okay!



Please note:

- You cannot earn more than one associate degree under the Free College Scholarship.
- You can use the Free College Scholarship to get two stacked, one-year certificates or a certificate and an associate degree in the following scenarios:
 - 1. If the two certificates are stackable. (Ex. Heating certificate, Plumbing certificate)
 - If the certificate leads to the associate degree. (Ex. Automotive Chassis certificate + Automotive Technology degree)
 - 3. If the two certificates are directly related. (Ex. Construction Technology certificate and Electrician Technology certificate)

Are you a Maine community college student who wants to continue your education at Maine's public universities?

With Transfer ME, you can bypass the traditional transfer application process and be directly admitted into the University of Maine System.

Save time and money and get your door-opening bachelor's degree fast.





What is Transfer ME?

Transfer ME is a pathway for Maine Community College System (MCCS) graduates to bypass the traditional transfer admissions process into the University of Maine System (UMS). Graduates from select UMS-MCCS transfer pathway programs are automatically admitted to one or more of Maine's public universities based on academic performance and progress.



Who is Eligible?

Entering First-year, first-time, full-time students. The student must be a resident of Penobscot County, Maine or attend a high school in Penobscot County, Maine.

Students must have a cumulative high school GPA of 3.0 or higher by the end of their junior year

Students and their families must have an adjusted gross income (AGI) of \$80,000 or less as reported on the student's FAFSA for their first year of enrollment at Husson.

What is the duration of the award?

Students will be awarded the Cyr Opportunity Scholarship for up to 4 years of undergraduate study. Students must maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress as outlined in the Husson Student Handbook. Students must maintain a minimum of 12 credits per semester or 24 credits in an academic year to remain eligible for upcoming semesters.

The scholarship with a combination of all other forms of financial aid will be equal to the cost of tuition for the students selected academic program.



GFSTM Noyce Scholarship

(Growing Future STEM Teachers in Maine)

- Two Years Free Tuition \$60,000 over two years, scholarships cover tuition for the junior and senior year, this may even cover some or all room and board.
- Travel to regional and national conferences and workshops on STEM & Secondary Education
- Field Experiences
- Support BEYOND the fourth year
 - Mentor After graduation, Scholars will have a mentor to provide classroom observations and just-in-time coaching.
 - Annual Professional Development
 - Professional Learning Community

Eligibility:

- Have completed at least 24 STEM or secondary education credits prior to their first semester as a Scholar and have a clear pathway to complete the program in two years.
- Be enrolled in one of the four STEM & Secondary Education programs by the application deadline. Transfer applicants must have completed the general SJC transfer application.
- Have earned a 3.0 cumulative GPA in their college courses or 2.7 with letter of recommendation
- Be a United States citizen or legal permanent resident (green card holder)
- Have demonstrated a passion for STEM & Secondary Education and an interest in teaching in high-needs schools. Those who have participated in GFSTM activities are strongly encouraged to apply.

Recipients of GFSTM Noyce Scholarships **commit to teaching for four years in a high-need school district after completion of the program**. GFSTM commits to supporting graduates through new teacher induction coaching, professional learning communities, and professional development opportunities.



What is the Promise Scholarship?

The Promise Scholarship supports up to 100 scholars every year – approximately 25 in each class – with top-off, multi-year scholarship awards that aim to cover up to 100% of a scholar's demonstrated need, as determined by the FAFSA.

It covers the cost of tuition, fees, housing, and meals. The award amount varies by student and sits on-top of a scholar's financial aid package including federal aid, state aid, and merit scholarships to meet a scholar's full need.


College Specific Programs

Am I eligible to apply?

To qualify for the Promise Scholarship a student:

- must be an incoming first-year or transfer undergraduate admitted to a USM degree program,
- must be a resident of the State of Maine,
- demonstrate financial need
- must intend to enroll on a full-time basis each term, demonstrate commitment to civic engagement and/or community service,
- be a first-generation college student (preferred),
- be nominated by a youth serving organization, community program, or school counselor

Applications are reviewed by a selection committee and are selected based on demonstrated financial need, notable leadership and civic engagement activities, academic achievement, and exceptional promise for success in college.



Maine residents are eligible for more than 1,800 undergraduate and graduate degree programs through Tuition Break.



The programs are offered by public colleges and universities in Connecticut, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont — all at a substantial tuition discount. Eligible students are charged a tuition rate that is significantly less than the regular out-of-state tuition rate.



Foreign Credentialing and Skills Recognition Grant Program

The Foreign Credentialing and Skills Recognition Grant Program provides small grants to assist eligible immigrants living in Maine who are not yet eligible to work in the United States prepare for entry into the workforce.

Grants for up to \$1,000 are available to help pay for the costs associated with the process of becoming work-ready while waiting for issuance of a work permit by federal immigration authorities.
