CAMPUS

ASSOCIATE DEGREE

C. Undergraduate degree awarded to a student after successfully completing a four-year program at a college or university.

BACHELOR'S DEGREE

D. School that provides education to undergraduates and awards bachelor's and sometimes master's degrees.

UNDERGRADUATE

E. Received after completing a 12 to 18 month program of study for a particular trade or skill.

COMMUNITY COLLEGE

F. College degree that is awarded after successfully completing a two-year program.

COLLEGE

G. A school of higher learning that typically awards undergraduate degrees and graduate degrees in various fields.

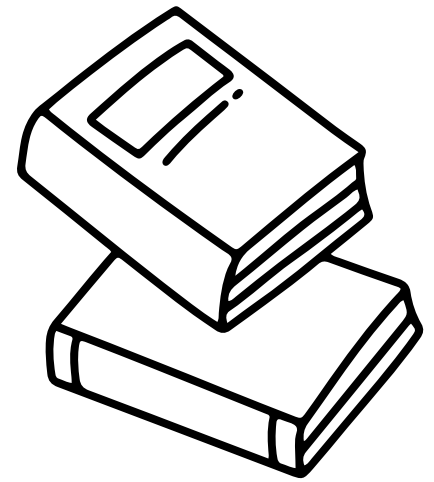
UNIVERSITY

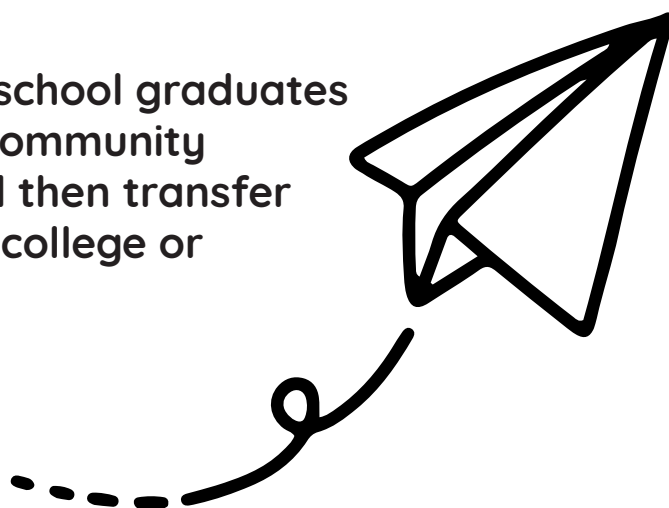
